CENTENNIAL COMMEMORATIVE MEDALLION

To commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Transpacific Yacht Race, a Limited Edition Centennial Medallion has been designed and minted in Hawaii. The medallions, limited to a total edition of 3,777, are struck to the highest minting standards in fine silver and 24kt gold. Featuring original artwork by the award-winning marine artist, Phil Uhl, the Transpac Centennial Medallion captures the true spirit of adventure that has captivated Transpac sailors over the last 100 years.

King David Kalakaua, featured in the obverse, first envisioned a race from California to his Hawaiian Kingdom, but his dream was not fulfilled until his friend, Clarence Macfarlane, organized the first race in 1906, after the king's death. The Hawaiian people affectionately called Kalakaua *Ke Ali'i Ka'apuni Honua*, or "the King who circumnavigated the globe", for being the first monarch in the world to sail the seven seas. Well known for his bon vivant nature as the "Merrie Monarch", he contributed more to the revival and resurgence of Hawaiian culture than any other King. The reverse celebrates the 100-year history of this prestigious race with Phil Uhl's rendering of the dramatic finish off Diamond Head - a memory cherished by every sailor who races the winds to paradise.
